## ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

The Universities Act 2012 requires that every accredited University in Kenya should have an Alumni Association for its graduates. Umma University Charter and Statues also provides for operationalization of the Alumni Association because the Association plays a crucial role in the University strategic growth and development. In order to comply with the requirement of the Act, Umma University graduates were facilitated to form Alumni Association on 5th July 2015 and their officials held a meeting with Ag. Vice-Chancellor on 22nd February 2016. The Association is now on operational awaiting formal registration from the Office of the Attorney General. The aim of Umma University Alumni Association is to create an environment in which University Alumni officials, former students, and friends stay connected to the University at all times. The Alumni also exists as a strategic vehicle to market and represent good image of the University to the larger public. The Alumni Association programmes of activities are coordinated by the Directorate of Research, Innovation and Outreach Affairs.

**BACKGROUND**  
Prof. Nizar visit was one of the achievements from the regional training workshop on enhancing research and publications that took place at Umma University on 18-20th December 2015. The idea of mentoring young Islamic regional universities originated from the discussion between Umma University Vice-Chancellor Dr. Ahmed Abdi Ahmed, Bro Abdul Hamid Slatch, East Africa IIIT Coordinator and Secretary General of IIIT, Prof. Hassan Omar Kasule on 19th December 2015 at the VC office.

Professor Nezar is a world renowned psychology professor from Bahrain and he has over fifty six years of experience as a university professor. He has been to different universities of the world, in Middle East countries, Europe, Africa and US. The professor is an established expert in psychological research and measures. Prof. Nizar has been the Vice-Chancellor of three different universities, Deputy Vice-Chancellor of the three universities and as a dean of three universities.

After strategic discussion with Umma University Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Nizar Al Ani delivered a lecture to staff of the University at the Main Campus, Kajiado titled "Live in Umma University as a family" on 2nd February 2016 between 11.30-12.30pm. Prof. Nizar advice during the lecture is summarized below.

- Work as a family and not as an employee. In this family of Umma University, we are all equal. Umma University belongs to me and you. It is ours all. It needs help from each one of us to solve our problems. Umma University staff is the vision of the University Vice-Chancellor.
- University family is one that shares common vision, mission and strategy. This family will always stand together, work together and succeed together since they share a common understanding, united by a purpose, which they all believed in it.
- Family life is a sacrifice, where both father and mother sacrifice always for the interest of all members of the family.
- We must all uphold the moral values of this great University. We need and must feel like one staff inspired to achieve his/her vision despite all the hurdles.
- We are the way to success of the University. We will be at the top when Umma University achieves the good of humanity, but not a personal good.

After the lecture by Prof. Nizar, he planted

a ceremonial tree supported by Dr. Ahmed Abdi Ahmed, Vice-Chancellor Umma University.

This was then followed by a group photo with visiting Prof. Nizar. On 3rd February 2016 Prof. Nizar had a meeting with Vice-Chancellor, Dr. Ahmed Abdi Ahmed; Dean School of Sharia & Islamic Studies, and Chairmen's of Departments at Thika Campus, Kiambu County. The meeting focused on the issue of trimester programme and its challenges. Main practice of International Higher Education Institution is 2 semester approach.

Quarter system as practiced in USA is hectic, demanding and expensive Prof. had an opportunity to meet with other academic and administrative faculty, where he delivered his lecture titled: "Integration of Knowledge-Atakumul Al-Ilm". Prof. said that integration of knowledge will assist Muslim scholars deepen their understanding of Islam, science and contemporary issues. This also helps in integrating revealed knowledge and human sciences and to bring back the legacy of Muslims from essence of knowledge. He advised the scholars that they should have an excellent background, learn to ask experts (truthful Ulemas) where necessary by conducting analysis of sharia-based opinion on contemporary issues. Prof. also urged the present Ulemas to embrace integration of science, technology and innovation to help address growing societal challenges. On 4th February 2016, Prof. Nizar met with Muslim leadership of non-governmental organizations and institutions in Kenya. Prof. advised these Muslim organizations and institutions to learn strategies of how to become sustainable, rather than depending on donors throughout their life. He illustrated sustainability opportunity by giving the examples below:

- Muslim organizations and institutions should be visible at counties so that they can get support from the county governments, local business people and others. He gave an example where local institutions through partnership and collaboration have succeeded

ed in establishing modern schools in poorly vulnerable villages using their own resources. He said that diaspora fun drive is also beneficial.

- Muslim organizations and institutions should invest in waqf projects. He told the Muslim leaders that they should advise their donors appropriately so that they accept to invest in waqf which will assist future programmes and projects.
- Muslim organizations and institutions should recognize and appreciate individual and collective donors by mentioning their names and status with intention of encouraging others to follow those good examples. He for instance, added that certain family or individual accept to establish scholarship programme for bright students at Umma University e.g. Sumait Scholarship Programme supported Dr. Sumait Family.
- He categorically advised Muslim organizations and institutions that they SHOULD NOT depend on foreign donors. He added that local options and initiative is always better, sustainable and beneficial. He gave an example where 3Muhsinin from Turkey are sponsoring a whole university with a student population of 30,000-50,000 students, where non-of them pay any tuition and accommodation expenses.

Alhamdulillah, Prof. Nizar was so happy with his visit to Kenya in support of strengthening development and strategic growth of Umma University and he has promised to come back to the country to train Umma University academic team on examination policy, quality, procedure and integrity. He also accepted to be one of the facilitators for the proposed Regional Arabic Workshop scheduled for 1-3rd April, 2016 at Thika Campus, Kiambu County, Kenya.

There is no doubt that Prof. Nizar Al Ani visit to Kenya, particularly to Umma University has enriched both management team, faculty members and students fraternity that the University can only become a successful institution and progress forward, when the staff members work as a united team and family members bonded by freshly engineered good work relationship based on moral values, vision, mission and strategies, wisdom and knowledge, an enabling environment and supportive organizational culture. Together we can always be better and prosperous.

## VISIT BY QATAR RED CRESCENT OFFICIALS TO UMMA UNIVERSITY

On the 8th February 2016, Umma University had two senior officers from Qatar Red Crescent. They are Dr. Fawz Oussedik, Head of International Relations and International Humanitarian Law, General Secretariat and Dr. Aisha Al-Mannai, who is also a senior member of Qatar Foundation and Prof. of Sharia in a Certain Qatar University. The team met with the University Acting Vice-Chancellor Dr. Ahmed Abdi Ahmed, Dr. Hussein Ali-Academic Registrar and Dr. Ali Adan-Director Research, Innovation and Outreach Affairs. The Qatar team was accompanied by bro Ahmed Idris, who is the head of policy and advocacy from Kenya Red Cross Society.

The Vice chancellor welcomed the special guests and briefed them on the background of Umma University, when it was Thika College for Sharia and Islamic studies (TCISIS). The College opened its door to students in 1997 and was collaborating with International University of Africa Sudan under the authorization from the then Commission for Higher Education (CHE). The TCISIS was later transformed to an independent private first Islamic University in Kenya under the name Umma University on 23rd July 2013. Umma University is a project of Direct Aid international, a Kuwait based NGO, formerly Africa Muslim Agency (AMA). The University has two Main Campuses, one at Kajiado and the other in Thika offering degree programmes in Nursing, Business Management, Computer Science, Islamic Studies and Islamic Sharia. The University currently has

a student population of 800 students undertaking degree, diplomas and certificates.

The VC also highlighted the challenges facing the University due to its infancy stage of development in the area of academic leadership, research and publication. The VC added that many faculty members are not aware of the various requirements by journal publishing house, where he requested the visiting partner to consider supporting.

Dr. Fawz and Dr. Aisha both thanked the VC for the brief. The visiting team explored opportunity for collaboration in the area of capacity building for Islamic scholars to get international experience, sharing of resources for growth of Umma University library, support collaboration and networking with Qatar Universities through research, conferences, workshops and seminars. The team also indicated the possibility for supporting scholarship for Umma University talented graduates to pursue postgraduate courses in Qatar Universities. The visitors were then taken round the University facilities like Library, Computer and Nursing skills laboratories. The special guests also visited Al-Manar Primary School. In the afternoon the visitors were taken to Thika

campus and they addressed the academic staff. At the end of the visit, the following were concluded:

- Umma University, Qatar Red Crescent and Qatar University should work together on identified areas of mutual interest including inviting Umma University academic and research staff to conferences, workshops and seminars.
- Qatar Red Crescent and its partner universities to assist Umma University graduates and staff with scholarship opportunity and exchange scheme.
- Qatar Red Crescent and its partner universities to assist Umma University School of Sharia and Islamic Studies to access online Arabic and Islamic resources in support of the University research and publications.
- Qatar Red Crescent and its partner universities to assist Umma University School of Sharia and Islamic Studies by supporting establishment and training of technical committee to develop and review proposed curriculum for the LLB and Sharia.
- Qatar Red Crescent and its partner universities to assist Umma University in enhancing the national capacity of the Kenya Qadhi so that they can effectively provide quality judicial services and leadership for Muslims in Kenya.
